1,238 cats trapped, fixed and vaccinated thanks to you!

Your kind and loving heart makes such a difference to animals – especially those living a cold, unhealthy and very risky life on the streets.

You may remember us writing to you last Spring for help with the massive influx of cats and kittens. And, like a caring friend, you responded!

With your help, 1,238 community cats were trapped, fixed and vaccinated last year - thanks to a "trapper grant" provided to our rescue partner, Indy Neighborhood Cats (INC). In total, INC trapped, fixed and vaccinated more than 2,300 cats in 2023! They also kept nearly 3,000 cats from entering the Indianapolis Animal Care Services (IACS) shelter and provided direct medical care to over 200 cats.

While the vast majority of community cats are returned to their colony after being fixed, those that can be adopted are brought into our shelter partners to find their loving fur-ever homes.





# You helped sweet Meadow get the emergency care she needed

Meadow is a six-month-old sweetheart pup who had some very bad luck. She was brought into shelter by a kind-hearted good Samaritan who found her on the side of the road and suspected she was hit by a car.

This adorable girl came in with **fractures on both of her legs, along with a dislocated shoulder**. After the good Samaritan brought Meadow into an emergency vet who couldn't provide care, an IACS animal control officer came and picked her up. She was taken to Noah's Emergency Animal Hospital – a partner of Indianapolis Animal Care Services (IACS).

Meadow was stabilized, treated for pain, and had the dislocation reduced. Then, she was taken to one of our rescue partners, where she had emergency orthopedic surgery on those two fractured legs. The operation went well! Once she's recovered, Meadow will be ready for her furever home.

### Winter overcrowding puts more animals at risk!

In January, the shelter faced extreme overcrowding due to cold and the many animals being sent there, and made an urgent plea to the public to adopt or foster animals.

As you know, the existing IACS shelter is already extremely overcrowded. When more animals come in to escape the cold, it puts a **massive burden on shelter and staff** – and increases the chance that some animals may be euthanized.

Last month, 50 out of 380 animals at the shelter were <u>living in crates or temporary</u> <u>housing</u>. While some caring humans have come forward to adopt or foster animals – **the situation is still very serious**.
